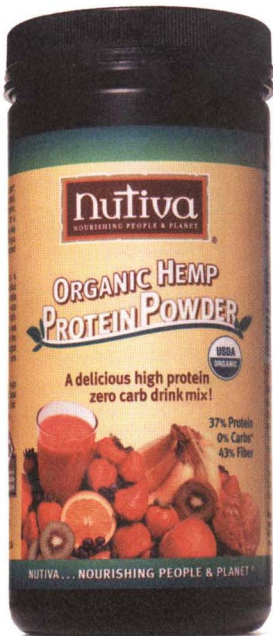


## Fresh Finds

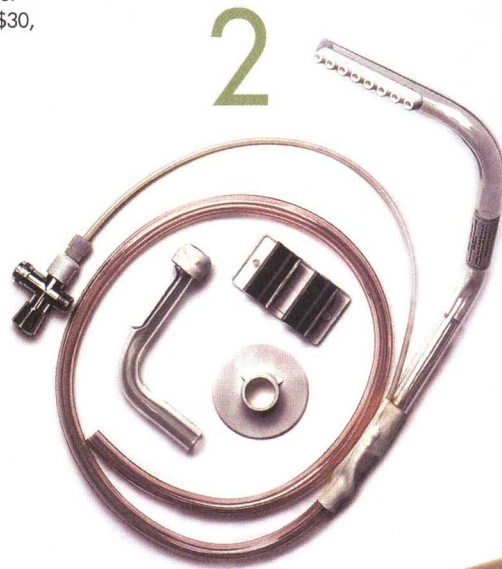
What's new in natural products

1. For a low-carbohydrate, high-protein supplement, try organic hemp protein powder. Hemp contains fiber, beneficial fats, and chlorophyll, and can be consumed in raw form—unlike other vegetable protein supplements. 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2. Reduce household water use by 10 percent with the Wow Shower, a system that recycles and filters bath water back in shower form. A jet pump powered by fresh water draws bath water up from the tub. Choose between the high flow model, which delivers 5.5 gpm (gallons per minute) using 2 gpm of fresh water, and the low flow model, which delivers 3 gpm using only 1 gpm of fresh water. \$30, Wow Shower.
